

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1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 BACKGROUND

FFS Refiners (Pty) Ltd (FFS) operates an existing facility in Evander that is authorised to process tar and liquid hydrocarbon fuels, blending, production of wood preservative compounds, and receiving, storing and re-distribution of various liquid hydrocarbon fuels.

FFS intends to process and store hydrocarbon waste streams at the existing facility. The existing authorised production and storage capacities will not be increased, and no new infrastructure will be constructed.

The facility is proposed to be situated at the current site located at 3 Brunel Rd, Evander, within the Govan Mbeki Local Municipality and Gert Sibande District Municipality, Mpumalanga Province(**Figure** 1-1).



Figure 1-1 - Locality of the Project

A Scoping and Environmental Impact Reporting (S&EIR) Process is required for the project. In terms of section 19 of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act (No. 59 of 2008) (NEM:WA), a list of waste management activities that have, or are likely to have a detrimental effect on the environment were published in GNR 921 (November 2013). WSP undertook a review of the listed activities according to the proposed project description to conclude that Listed Activities 2, 3 and 4 under Category B and Listed Activity 2 under Category are considered applicable:



- Activity B 2 The reuse or recycling of hazardous waste in excess of 1 ton per day, excluding reuse or recycling that takes place as an integral part of an internal manufacturing process within the same premises.
- Activity B3 The recovery of waste including the refining, utilisation, or co-processing of the waste at a facility that processes in excess of 100 tons of general waste per day or in excess of 1 ton of hazardous waste per day, excluding recovery that takes place as an integral part of an internal manufacturing process within the same premises.
- Activity B4 The treatment of hazardous waste in excess of 1 ton per day calculated as a monthly average; using any form of treatment excluding the treatment of effluent, wastewater, or sewage.

According to Section 22 of the National Environmental Management Air Quality Act (NEM:AQA) an Atmospheric Emission Licence (AEL) is required in terms of GNR 893:

Activity 2.5 - Industrial Fuel Oil Recyclers

WSP Group Africa (Pty) Ltd (WSP) has been appointed as the independent and suitably qualified EAP by FFS, to manage and undertake the S&EIR Process.

1.2 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROCESS

1.2.1 PURPOSE

Public participation is understood to be a series of inclusive and culturally appropriate interactions aimed at providing stakeholders with opportunities to express their views, so that these can be considered and incorporated into the decision-making process. Effective public participation requires the prior disclosure of relevant and adequate project information to enable stakeholders to understand the risks, impacts, and opportunities of the proposed Project.

Basic reasons why the public is involved in the EA process include the following:

- The environment is held in public trust; therefore, use of environmental resources is everyone's concern.
- Public participation is a proper, fair conduct in public decision-making activities. Focus on vulnerable and disadvantaged person and offer equitable participation due to historical issues.
- It is a way to ensure that projects meet citizens' needs and are suitable to the affected public.
- The project carries more legitimacy, and less hostility, if Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) are able to influence the decision-making process.
- Finally, the final decision is informed when local knowledge and values are included and when expert knowledge is publicly examined.

1.2.2 OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Public Participation Process (PPP) can be summarised as follows:

- Identify relevant individuals, organisations and communities who may be interested in or affected by the project.
- Clearly outline the scope of the proposed Project, including the scale and nature of the existing and proposed activities.
- Identify viable proposed Project alternatives that will assist the relevant authorities in making an informed decision.
- Identify shortcomings and gaps in existing information.



- Identify key concerns, raised by I&APs that should be addressed in the subsequent specialist studies.
- Highlight the potential for environmental impacts, whether positive or negative.
- To inform and provide the public with information and an understanding of the proposed Project, issues, and solutions.

1.2.3 WHAT IS AN INTERESTED AND AFFECTED PARTY?

An I&AP is defined as any person, group of persons or organisations interested in or affected by an activity, and any organ of state that may have jurisdiction over any aspect of the activity.

The difference between an I&AP and a registered I&AP is as follows:

- An I&AP can be directly or indirectly impacted on by a proposed activity.
- A registered I&AP is a person whose name has been placed on the register of registered I&APs. According to the PPP Guidance document, 2017, only registered I&APs will be notified:
 - of the availability of reports and other written submissions made to the Competent Authority (CA) by the Applicant, and be entitled to comment on these reports and submissions; and
 - of the outcome of the application, the reasons for the decision, and that an appeal may be lodged against a decision.

For the purpose of this report, registered I&APs will be referred to as stakeholders.

1.2.4 RIGHTS, ROLES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE STAKEHOLDER

In terms of Chapter 6, specifically Section 43(1) of the EIA Regulations promulgated under NEMA, stakeholders have the right to bring to the attention of the CA any issues that they believe may be of significance to the consideration of the application. The rights of stakeholders are qualified by certain obligations, namely:

- Stakeholders must ensure that their comments are submitted within the timeframes that have been approved by the Department of Minerals, Resources and Energy (DMRE), or within any extension of a timeframe agreed by the Applicant, Environmental Assessment Practitioner (EAP) and/or CA.
- Disclose to the EAP any direct business, financial, personal, or other interest that they might have in the approval or refusal of the application.

The roles of stakeholders in a PPP usually include one or more of the following:

- Assisting in the identification and prioritisation of issues that need to be investigated.
- Making suggestions on alternatives and means of preventing, minimising, and managing negative impacts and enhancing benefits of the activities conducted.
- Assisting in or commenting on the development of mutually acceptable criteria for the evaluation of decision options.
- Contributing information on public needs, values, and expectations.
- Contributing local and traditional knowledge.
- Verifying that their issues have been considered.

In order to participate effectively, stakeholders should:

- become involved in the process as early as possible;
- register as a stakeholder;



- advise the EAP of other stakeholders who should be consulted;
- contribute towards the design of the public participation process (including timeframes) to ensure that it is acceptable to all stakeholders;
- follow the process once it has been concluded;
- read the material provided and actively seek to understand the issues involved;
- give timeous responses to correspondence;
- be respectful and courteous towards other stakeholders;
- refrain from making subjective, unfounded, or ill-informed statements; and
- recognise that the process is confined to issues that are directly relevant to the application.

1.2.5 APPROACH TO STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

The stakeholder engagement approach is based on the following principles:

- Undertake meaningful and timely participation with stakeholders.
- Focus on important issues during the process.
- Undertake due consideration of alternatives.
- Take accountability for information used.
- Encourage co-regulation, shared responsibility, and a sense of ownership over the proposed Project lifecycle.
- Apply "due process" particularly with regard to the PPP as provided for in the EIA Regulations, 2014 promulgated under NEMA.
- Consider the needs, interests, and values of stakeholders.

The public participation guideline in terms of the EIA Regulations, 2014 promulgated under NEMA tabulates the level of public participation required for various levels of anticipated project impacts.

2 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION TO DATE

2.1 PRE-APPLICATION PHASE STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT

Tasks undertaken during the Pre-Application Phase are detailed in the following Sections.

2.1.1 IDENTIFICATION OF KEY STAKEHOLDERS

The Pre-application Phase commenced with the compilation of a stakeholder database to include relevant stakeholders, such as Commenting Authorities, landowners/occupiers, and Ward Councillors, as well as any other I&APs who may be interested or affected by the project. A copy of the stakeholder database is included in **Appendix A**.

Relevant authorities (Organs of State) have been automatically registered as I&APs. In accordance with the EIA Regulations, 2014 all other persons must request in writing to be placed on the register, submit written comments, or attend meetings in order to be registered as stakeholders and included in future communication regarding the project.

Section 41 of the EIA Regulations, 2014 states that written notices must be given to identified stakeholders as outlined in **Table 2-1**.

2.2 SCOPING PHASE

The Draft Scoping Report was placed on public review for a period of 30 days from **26 March** to **30 April 2024** at the Secunda Public Library and the Evander Public Library. Additionally, an electronic version of the report was placed on the WSP Group Africa (Pty) Ltd (WSP) website to be accessed by the public at the following link: https://www.wsp.com/en-ZA/services/public-documents.



Proof of the placement of the draft Scoping Report (DSR) in the public domain is included in **Appendix C.1**.

2.2.1 DIRECT NOTIFICATION

Notification of the proposed project was issued to registered I&APs and stakeholders, via direct correspondence (i.e. email and sms) between 22 and 26 March 2024. The purpose of the notification was to offer potential I&APs and stakeholders the opportunity to register on the project database and the opportunity to comment on the DSR.

Proof of notification is included in **Appendix C.2** and **Appendix C.3** of this report.

2.2.2 ADVERTISEMENT

Notification of the proposed project as well as an opportunity to register and comment on the DSR was issued to the general public via an advertisement published in the Ridge Times and The Star newspapers on 22 and 26 March 2024 respectively, in English. A copy of the advertisement is included as **Appendix B**.

2.2.3 SITE NOTICES

The EIA Regulations, 2014, as amended, require that site notices be fixed at places conspicuous to the public at the boundary or on the fence of the site where the activity (to which the application relates) is to be undertaken, as well as at any alternative sites. Posters (in English), conforming to the size specifications as per the EIA Regulations, 2014 were placed on Friday, 26 March 2024, at the following points:

SECUNDA - The civil rights organisation AfriForum brought an urgent application against Rand Water following the water supplier's decision to reduce water supply to several municipalities, including Govan Mbeki Municipality (GMM).

AfriForum released a statement stating the request for an interdict to force Rand Water to restore water supply to capacity.

This follows AfriForum's legal team sending an urgent letter of demand to Rand Water

last week, demanding to restore water supply to the Emfuleni Local Municipality

and Lesedi Local Municipality in the Sedibeng District Municipality in Gauteng; Rand West Local Municipality and Merafong City Local Municipality in the West Rand District Municipality in Gauteng; Ngwathe Local Municipality in the Fezile Dabi District Municipality in the Free State and Govan Mbeki Local Municipality in Mpumalanga.

The organisation says access to clean water is a basic human right; it is essential for health, sanitation and overall quality of life.

The decision to reduce the water supply - though it may be driven by operational or financial constraints – has far-reaching implications for the affected communities, especially the most vulnerable.

AfriForum claims Rand Water has placed an unnecessary burden on vulnerable communities, exacerbating existing socioeconomic challenges.

"AfriForum strongly condemns Rand Water's actions to cut water supply. While we recognise the challenges that water suppliers face; we believe these decisions must be made with careful consideration for the wellbeing of the communities they serve," said Petrus Coetzee, AfriForum's advisor for local government affairs.

"We believe cooperation between water suppliers, government authorities and civil society organisations is essential

to find sustainable solutions to challenges with water supply."

Coetzee said for the sake of accountability

transparency, AfriForum has initiated legal proceedings against Rand Water to address the concerns caused by this matter.

"AfriForum remains committed to its mission to protect the rights and interests of our communities and will continue to monitor and fight similar issues if necessary," concluded Coetzee.

A recent update by the Govan Mbeki Municipality confirms Rand Water is pumping water at full capacity and the water supply system is gradually recovering.

GMM indicated on social media that some areas such as Bethal, eMzinoni, Thistle Grove, portions of Trichardt, Charl Cilliers and Secunda are still affected with no water supply. This is because of high demand and low water levels at the reservoirs. Water tankers will be used to assist the affected areas.

Rehab opened for women

SECUNDA - The Yahweh Rapha Addiction Treatment Centre opened its doors for men on June 1, 2021, and has now opened a centre for

Since the women's centre opened on March 4, they have already admitted three women.

The initiators of this centre, Marc and Chantelle-lee Fick, said they found the Lord after struggling with their own addictions.

The couple met Jean du Plessis who was in Secunda at that time for contract work, and he became the couple's mentor towards not just becoming a "Christian". He guided them to understand that the Gospel is not just about being saved but about acting out the Lord's mandate set out in Matthew 10:8. That is where "religion" turned into a "relationship" with the Lord.

The couple began to realise that God is Love and therefore they needed to love as well.

With Jean's guidance, the couple began reaching out to people living on the streets and prayed for them before they were asked to lead the addiction support group at Lighthouse Church in 2018.

"We realised one man in the support group needed rehabilitation, so we sent him to the Yahweh Rapha Addiction Treatment Centre in Vanderbijlpark," said Chantelle-lee.

"This man lived on the streets of Secunda for a long time and is HIV+. Doctors said the medication would not work for him anymore, but we kept praying for him and he kept on fighting to stay clean and to proclaim truth in who is in Christ. Today, he is clean, married and has a baby."

Such success stories and the will to obey the Holy Spirit drive Chantelle-lee and Marc to continue doing what they do.

"Before we opened the centre between Secunda and Evander, we sent many men to the one in Vanderbijlpark. Marc still said he never wants to open a rehabilitation centre, because it takes a lot out of

you emotionally, physically and spiritually."

However God had other plans, and without planning it the Holy Spirit put it in Marc and Chantellelee's hearts to actually open a rehabilitation centre.

"Marc called Gary Mortimer, who is the owner of the centre in Vanderbijlpark, and told him what we had experienced. He said it answered his prayers because he prayed for someone else to open a centre in a different town."

Abby Beukes is Chantelle-lee's right hand at the centre, and her background working as a youth leader at the church equipped her to work with recovering addicts.

This women's centre can house 40 women, and they are planning for a gym, which already has three a hairdresser.

"This is a community project with several churches, businesses and individuals involved," said Chantelle-lee.

These centres survive on donations, and the addicts' families who can afford it pay for their recovery programmes. Those struggling with addiction who do not have any family to sponsor them financially, depend on the centre's management to find them sponsors via churches, businesses or individuals who want to reach out.

Part of the recovery programme is to help those who complete it to set up their CVs and help them find jobs.

The Yahweh Rapha Addiction Treatment Centre is a registered NPO.

Marc took a leap of faith and resigned from his full-time job for involvement at the centre, also on a full-time basis.

Chantelle-lee works part-time and invests the rest of her time at the centre.

She invites anyone interested to the support group on Wednesday nights that still runs at the Lighthouse Church.

Comments:

The sensitivity of the proposed footprint area was assessed according to the Mpumalanga Biodiversity Sector Plan (MBSP, 2014). This sensitivity is assessed in terms of both terrestrial and freshwater assessments. In the MBSP, sensitive areas are identified in terms of *Critical Biodiversity Areas* (CBAs) and *Ecological Support Areas* (ESAs). CBAs and ESAs are necessary to ensure protection of biodiversity, environmental sustainability, and human well-being. CBAs are required to meet both national and provincial biodiversity targets. These areas should remain natural.




Figure 1: MBSP based Land Cover map on the remainder of portion 54 of the farm Winkelhaak 135 JT

According to the MBSP Land Cover map, figure 1, the proposed development is in an area used as a mining area. The locality of the processing plants is indicated with two rectangles.

Recommendation

The Department confirms receipt of the Draft Environmental Impact Assessment Report (DEIAR) for the above-mentioned project dated August 2024. The Department has evaluated the submitted DEIAR and has the following comments.

- 1. The meaning of the acronym 'MIT' is unclear. May you please ensure that your Final Environmental Impact Assessment report (FEIAR) provides clarity.
- 2. Item 4.3 of the EIAR indicates that two new tri-canters will be placed on the existing decanter/centrifuge plant. Please indicate if these tri-canters will be replacing existing infrastructure or will be added to existing infrastructure. If it is additional to existing infrastructure specific for the waste streams to be processed, it will be seen as construction for the implementation of the listed activities applied for.
- 3. Item 4.3 also refers to a 'deash process'. The meaning of this is unclear. May you please ensure that your FEIAR provides clarity.

- 4. The list of waste streams to be processed on page 49 indicates that the waste streams to be accepted for processing may be expanded. The Waste Management Licence (WML) will include a list of only the waste streams included in the FEIAR, which will limit the facility in processing any additional waste streams not mentioned in the FEIAR.
- 5. Item 4.4.3, and impact assessment contain activities associated with decommissioning. This WML application does, however, not include decommissioning as a listed activity. Should the facility be decommissioned, a new WML will be required since it is a listed activity in GN 921.
- 6. Page 47 of the EMPr made mention of "planned routes", but the DEIAR indicates that the existing road infrastructure will be used. May you please ensure that your FEIAR addresses this inconsistency.
- 7. The terminology such as 'regularly', 'adequately' and 'timeously' have been used in the EMPr. The timeframes and measures must be specific.
- 8. Page 52 of the EMPr has indicated that recovery, recycling and reuse of general waste must be done as far as possible. It is not clear how this will be done on site, or whether the listed activities in GN 921 will be triggered or not. May you please ensure that your FEIAR provides clarity.
- 9. Table 7-6 (page 53) of the EMPr indicated that all hazardous waste will be stored in a covered, sealed skip. It is not clear whether hazardous waste will be generated on site, or hazardous waste will be generated elsewhere to be introduced into the processing plant. May you please ensure that your FEIAR provides clarity.
