NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF THE GLENCORE OPERATIONS SOUTH AFRICA (PTY)LTD LAKENVLEI REHABILITATION PROJECT, EMAKHAZENI MUNICIPALITY, MPUMALANGA PROVINCE

Regulation 41(2) of GNR 982 (as amended) published under section 24 and 24D of the National Environmental Management Act (No. 107 of 1998) ("NEMA") (as amended) for submission of various applications for environmental authorisations ("EAs") in respect of activities identified in terms of GNR 983, GNR 984 and GNR 985 (as amended).

Glencore Operations South Africa (Pty) Ltd. ("GOSA") manages several coal mining operations, which include the Goedgevonden Colliery ("GGV"). GGV is an existing opencast coal mining operation located within the Emalahleni Local Municipality, Nkangala District Municipality.

Wetland offsets were proposed as an offset for the impact associated with the loss of large wetland habitat at the GGV Mine. The GGV Water Use License ("WUL") 24084063 of 19 April 2007 was issued on condition that wetland rehabilitation takes place as an offset for the wetland loss in GGV mining. The WUL required that the wetland offset be a ratio of 1: 2 (for every 1 hectare lost, 2 hectares must be rehabilitated). The direct wetland loss of 584 hectares at the GGV mine, resulted in a wetland offset target of 1 168 hectares. To find a wetland area this large to conserve and manage, GGV had to look for sites beyond its catchment borders. The Lakenvlei wetland clusters 1-7 (within The Greater Lakenvlei Protected Environment (GLPE)) was identified as a suitable offset option. The proposed project is located with eMakhazeni Local Municipality.

This BA Process is for structures that will trigger NEMA Listed Activities, which require EA within Clusters 2-7 associated with Phase 2 of the wetland rehabilitation.

The following properties will be affected by the project:

- Portions 0, 2, 3, 7, 11, 15, 17, 18, 19 of the Farm Middelpunt 320 JT
- Portions 4, 6, 11 of the Farm Lakenvlei 355 JT
- Portions 7, 9 of the Farm Zwartkoppies 316 JT

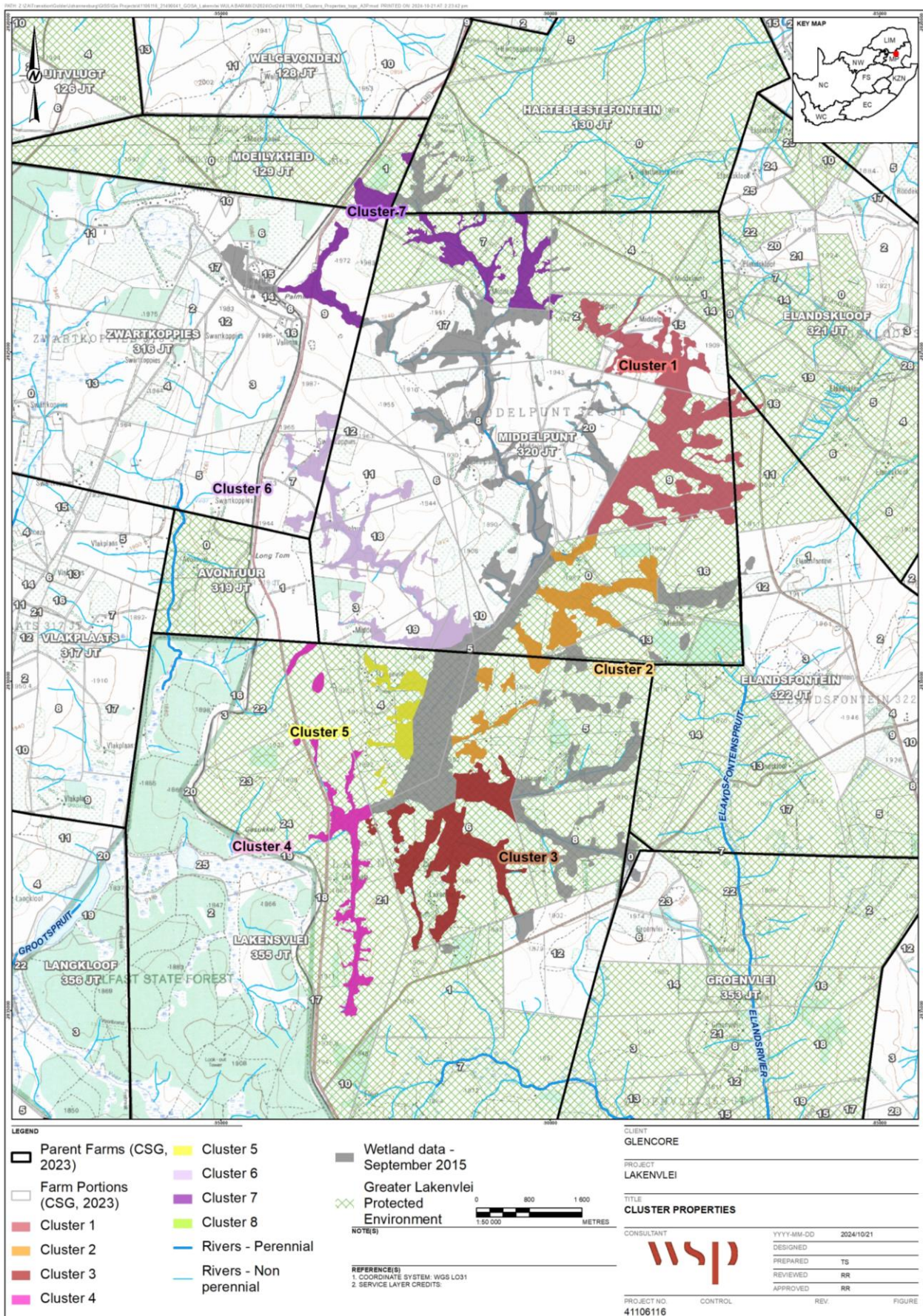


Figure 1: Locality of the project site (map is for orientation purposes only)

The purpose of this background information document (BID) is to provide Interested and Affected Parties (I&APs) with more information about Glencore Operations South Africa (Pty) Ltd intent to undertake a wetland rehabilitation project as an offset for their Goedgevonden Colliery mining wetland loss. In addition, we would like to encourage stakeholders to register as I&APs and invite them to contribute through providing comment, asking questions and raising issues of concern or suggestions for project enhancement.

BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

Glencore Operations South Africa (Pty) Ltd. (GOSA) manages several coal mining operations operated by various legal entities, which include the Goedgevonden Colliery (GGV), an existing opencast coal mining operation in Emalahleni Local Municipality, Nkangala District Municipality.

GGV's approved 2006 Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Environmental Monitoring Program (EMPr) application found that approximately 629 hectares of delineated wetland habitat was present in the proposed mining areas (underground mining and open cast) that would be lost/impacted due to the planned mining activity. Wetland offsets were proposed as a compromise for the impact associated with the loss of large wetland habitat at this mine.

The GGV Water Use License (WUL) 24084063 of 19 April 2007 was issued on condition that wetland rehabilitation takes place as an offset for the wetland loss in GGV mining. The WUL required that the wetland offset be a ratio of 1: 2 (for every 1 hectare lost, 2 hectares must be rehabilitated). The direct wetland loss of 584 hectares at the GGV mine, resulted in a wetland offset target of 1 168 hectares. To find a wetland area this large to conserve and manage, GGV had to look for sites beyond its Municipal and catchment borders. The Lakenvlei wetland clusters 1-7 (The Greater Lakenvlei Protected Environment (GLPE)) was identified as a suitable offset option for the rehabilitation of 1 168ha of wetland.

PROJECT LOCATION

The Greater Lakenvlei Wetland was declared a Protected Environment, in terms of sections 28(1)(a)(i) and (b) of NEM: PAA, by MEC, Mr. Vusi Shongwe, of the Department of Agriculture, Rural Development, Land and Environmental Affairs (DARDLEA) on 7 April 2017. The GLPE is located 8km north of Belfast in Wards 4 and 6 of the Emakhazeni Local Municipality, Nkangala District Municipality, within the Mpumalanga Province.

The GLPE area comprises 9365 ha of which 1131 ha are delineated wetlands, known as the Lakenvlei wetland system. The greater Lakenvlei wetland systems provide crucial ecosystem services as healthy wetland systems support human livelihoods, purify water and trap nitrates, regulate stream flow, maintain biodiversity, help flood attenuation, and prevent erosion due to the vegetation cover typically present in wetlands. Being a large wetland system with a conservation status makes the GLPE an ideal project site for the GGV Wetland Offset. Improving the wetland functionality and "Present Ecological Status" (PES) of the wider wetland system will be of great value for the wider catchment, the GLPE area, the private landowners, and GGV to be able to realise and achieve their wetland offsetting goals and targets.

THE OFFSET STRATEGY

The focus of the GGV wetland offset strategy is to help improve the Present Ecological Status within the GLPE, through rehabilitation and management initiatives. The wetland systems have been divided into eight wetland clusters (Cluster 1-8) for the purpose of implementing the offset strategy.

GGV (the applicant) plans to:

- Maintaining the existing wetland rehabilitation structures already in place (41 x structures). Some of the existing structures require replacing, some repair and others no intervention,
- Repairing and formalising damaged spillways (6 x spillways), existing informal access routes that cross the wetlands (7 x structures), and a dam wall within the wetland,
- Stabilising headcuts (3 x drop structures),
- Removing certain dam walls that are restricting flow within the wetlands (3 x small dams),
- Constructing new wetland rehabilitation structures (Dongalocks and concrete weirs) in strategic locations (4 x new structures),

- Restricting future and further agricultural infringement in the wetlands themselves, and
- Removing heavy alien invasive vegetated areas within the GLPE area (up to 45ha).

The offset strategy is being implemented in a phased manner. Phase 1 and 2 of the offset strategy, focused on Dongalock installations in wetland Clusters 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 and 7 have already been completed. This rehabilitation work did not require Environmental Authorisation (EA). A General Authorisation (GA) through DWS was obtained for this stage of rehabilitation.

The other structures and instream rehabilitation activity planned for clusters 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 trigger the need for a Water Use Authorisation (for altering the characteristics of a watercourse) in terms of National Water Act, 1998 (Act 36 of 1998) (NWA) and environmental authorisation (for infill and removal of more than 10m³ of material within a watercourse, placing infrastructure in a wetland and the clearance of indigenous vegetation within a protected ecosystem type) in terms of the EIA Regulations GN R.324 to GN R.327 published under the National Environmental Management Act (NEMA), 1998 (Act 107 of 1998) (NEMA).

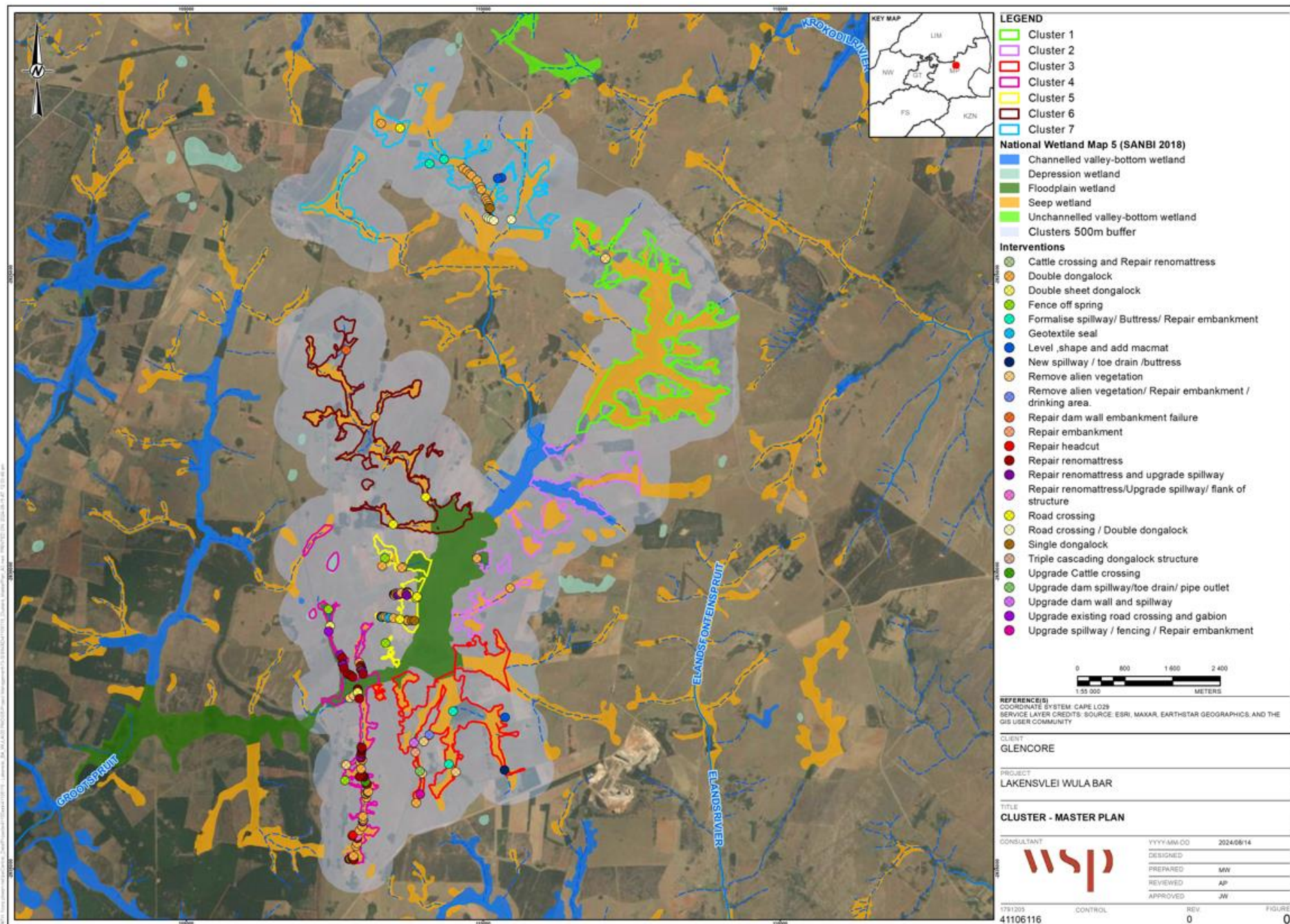
THE PLANNED ACTIVITIES THAT REQUIRE EA

The planned activities described below require environmental authorisation (EA):

- The total cumulative construction footprint area will be 0.6ha (6 329m²),
- The total anticipated infill volumes within the wetland will be 4 118m³,
- Approximately 0.589ha of indigenous vegetation will be "cleared" within the project footprint for the rehabilitation sites, and

Approximately 45ha of alien vegetation has been earmarked for removal within the current GLPE.

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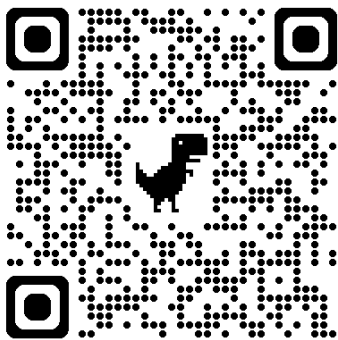
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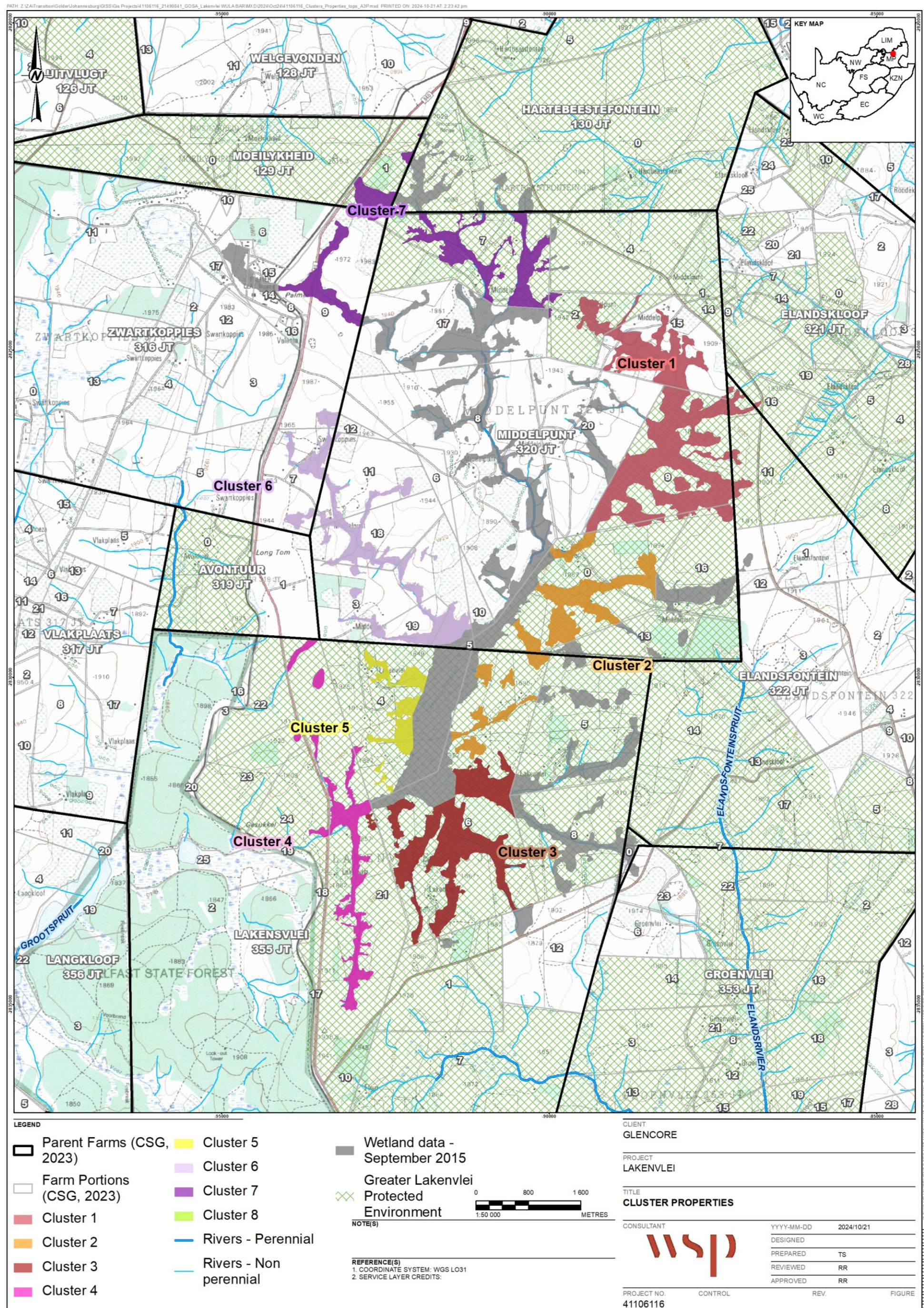


Figure 1: Locality of the project site (map is for orientation purposes only)

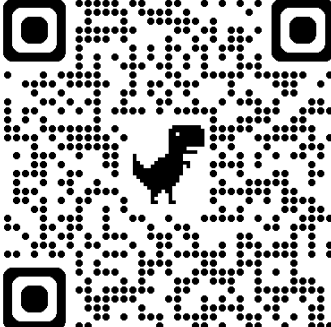

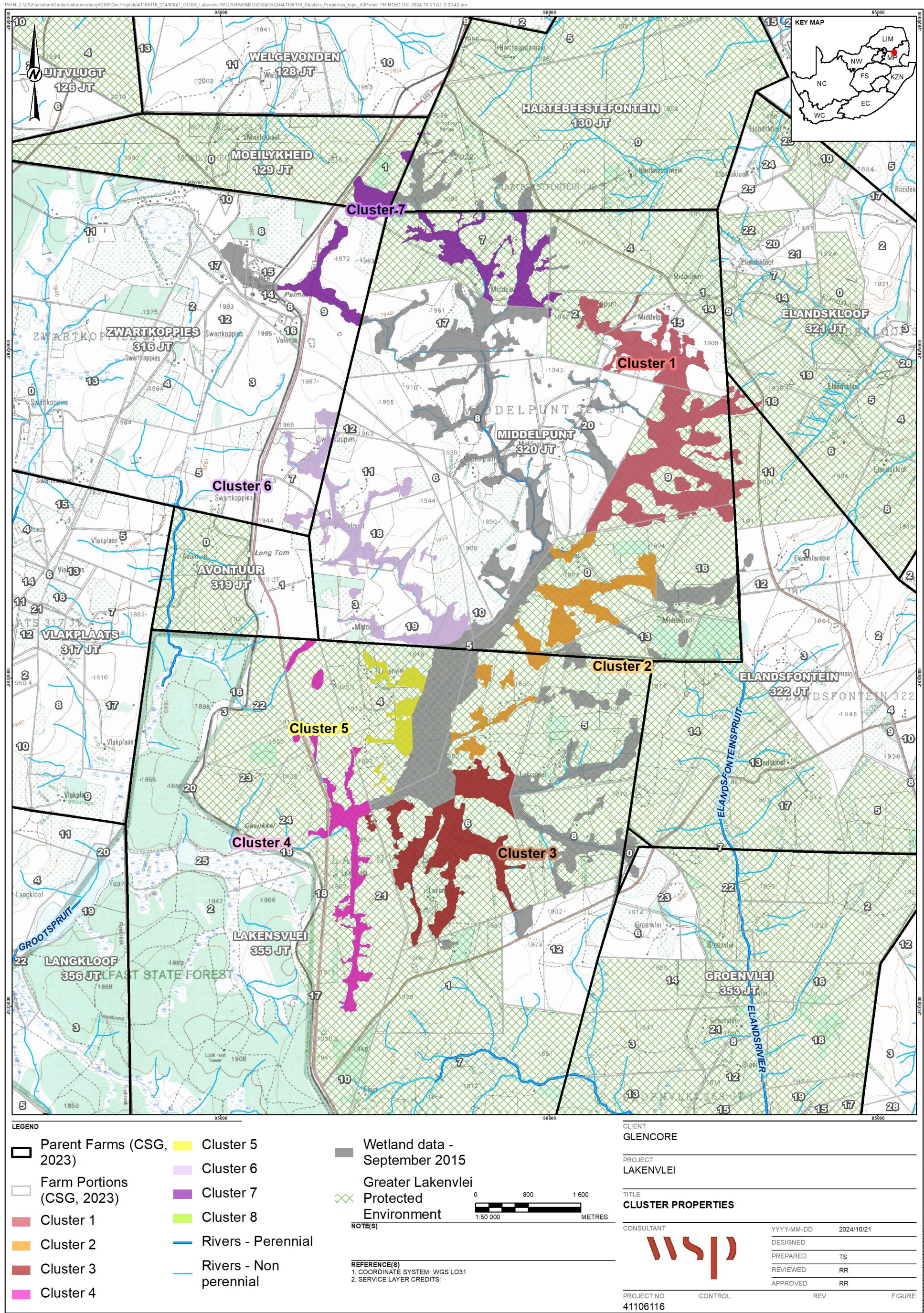
