ECONOMIC GROWTH HIGHLIGHTS

USAID PAKISTAN WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

- Worked with 258 local Community Organizations to organize 60 community-based events that engaged and identified 14,000 youth (42% girls) for enrollment at training institutions, job placement and apprenticeships.
- Strengthened the capacity of 22 training institutes through instructors’ capacity development, curricula modernization, and modern lab equipment.
- Enrolled 5,761 marginalized youth (60% girls) in market-demanded skilling courses; enabled 1,110 youth access to entrepreneurship training, access to finance, and career counseling; and placed 3,205 youth in jobs.
- Forged linkages between training institutes and private employers to introduce market-driven and employer-demanded skilling courses.

UKAID NEPAL ACCESS TO FINANCE FOR THE POOR

- Managed a £14M Challenge Fund that unlocked £443M investment in Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) for women, youth, and disadvantaged groups.
- Partnered with 45 financial institutions through 81 co-investment projects to expand financial services to over 2.6M customers (50% women), including 108,000 MSMEs.
- Helped financial institutions launch 43 innovative financial products and services and digitize 12 MFIs.
- Co-invested in financial literacy programs reaching 433,466 MSMEs and households with new financial education products.
